

## **Pneumonia – Intermediate Risk Case (score 2 – 3)**

### “Near Live” Usability Testing

History (Standardized patient):

Provider: “Hi, what brings you in today?”

*Patient coughs every minute throughout the encounter and fatigued due to high fever.*

Patient: “I have had a cough for the past week and I think I might have a fever. About 3 days ago I woke up with a cough out of nowhere. And I’ve been pretty much coughing since then. I really hope it’s nothing too serious.

I’ve been coughing up a lot of phlegm—just sort of yellowish, no blood or anything. It’s been harder to breath too. And I’ve been really tired.

I started feeling feverish yesterday. Then I got the chills last night. I just had to call in sick and I pretty much slept the entire day yesterday.

What do you think this could be?”

Physical Exam (Provided in written form):

T 103, HR 75, ENT: pharyngeal erythema, Neck: no LAD, Lungs: Decreased BS – right lower lung field, CTABL
